Two Guerrilla Productions shorts make the cut at "Zempire Film Festival"

Portland's Guerrilla Productions announces that two GP shorts, *Revival* and *Con of the Dead* have made the cut at the first annual Zempire Film Festival in Portland, OR. In addition, the Zempire Film Festival (<http://www.Zempire.com/>) will be screening the latest trailer from Guerrilla Productions feature film project *Flesh of my Flesh*, now in post-production.

Revival is a cautionary tale of one of the potential problems with the provocative notion that one might freeze or otherwise suspend oneself to be revived and cured in the future. The question, of course, is *who* will do the reviving, and *why*.

Con of the Dead is the result of the "Let's Make a Movie!" workshop hosted by Guerrilla Productions at Norwescon (<http://www.norwescon.org/>) every year. This is the workshop's seventh year. As a rule, the movies are thought up, brainstormed and scripted in two hours, shot in four hours, and edited in six hours.

Also at the Zempire Film Festival, people will have their first glimpse of GP's new feature film *Flesh of my Flesh*, now in post-production. "We're very excited about this project," says Director Edward Martin III, "and I'm really glad we can show a trailer that even creeps us out, and still keeps secret things secret."

Guerrilla Productions, fueled almost entirely by caffeine, has completed half a dozen short movies since the initial release of *The Dream-Quest of Unknown Kadath* and is currently in post-production on *Flesh of my Flesh* (www.FleshOfMyFlesh.com), a live action horror/thriller with Lovecraftian undertones.
